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


VN: <1/2 of Australia N-to-S; <5% of the area; but >5x Australia's population




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
VN GDP growth galloping – averaging 7% since 1990



VN suffered high inflation in 1980s – but under better (perhaps not perfect) control now







Figure 7: East Asian Bilateral Trade Flows Rounded to Nearest 1% of Regional Flows (line width proportional to %)





VN business issues

- WTO entry on 11/01/2007 is leveling the playing field
 - VN joining the global supply chain
 - "Equitisation" of state-owned businesses & emergence of vigorous (but still small) private sector
- Transition towards a market economy
 - Need for local partners
 - Language and availability of skilled staff
 - Bureaucracy/provincial government
 - A few strikes aimed at foreign factory owners!
 - "Corruption in the business operating environment remains a key concern"*
